Certification and Contracting Process



Key Member Feedback Received and Discussion on 10/12:

- Several members of the TAG would like to see more standardization of auditing and monitoring of AMHs across the plans.
- DHHS recognizes that NCQA plan-to-CIN/provider delegation standards for care management do not currently align completely with AMH Tier 3 model and is interested in the TAG helping to think through how to streamline auditing and monitoring.
 - Several members of the TAG gave the feedback that taking the route of requiring NCQA accreditation at the CIN or provider level adds too much cost and administrative burden.

Data Sharing



Key Member Feedback Received on 10/12:

- AMH Tier 3 data sharing has been varied and inconsistent so far;
 hoping to see better fidelity to existing data specifications.
- Access to <u>cost</u> data is critical to solve for, especially as higher levels of VBP contemplated. Almost no AMHs/CINs are getting access to cost data.
- "We need a better pathway to the HIE."

How should DHHS work with the TAG to develop HIE priorities for quality & pop health?

Quality



Key Member Feedback Received on 10/12:

- "Limiting contracting to the AMH measure set was immensely. helpful for aligning measures across PHPs".
- Quality performance data is not yet consistently flowing to AMH Tier 3 practices.
- Not clear about PHP incentive programs—how we will get rates;
 what targets/benchmarks are.
- Alignment on using race and ethnicity data for stratification and identification of disparities.

Key Member Feedback Received and Discussion on 10/12:

- AMH TAG members are seeking some stability in the AMH program.
- "Please minimize the number of program design changes in the short term."
- Practices are concerned about staffing shortages and burnout.
- How do we leverage what we built; strengthen those investments?

- How can DHHS ramp up VBP incentives for practice level population health, quality, and awareness of total cost of care?
- How could DHHS consider aligning its VBP strategy with other NC payers?
- Can we do more to promote Health Equity and Integrated Care?
- How does ongoing work on Healthy Opportunities Pilots and InCK help shape iteration of the entire AMH Program?
