Re: 2005 Monitoring

Dear County Director of Social Services:

Counties that failed the Adjusted Report Card 3 or more times from December 2003 through November 2004 must be monitored. The monitoring process is outlined in MA-3217/MA-2305, Evaluating County/DDS Performance. In addition, every county must be monitored at least every other year; therefore, if your county was not monitored during 2004, you will be monitored this year.

The monitors determine which counties will be monitored in 2005 based on the failures in the report cards for 2004 and if waivers were granted for those failed report cards. The cases to be monitored will begin no earlier than December 2003 or no earlier than 12 months prior to the month monitoring will occur.

Attached is a list of the counties to be monitored. These counties will be contacted at some point in the coming months to send their records to the Application Monitoring Section.

Those counties who failed once or twice may have received a waiver of the report card failure. By seeking a waiver of the report card failure, the county may postpone the monitoring until 2006. However, even though a waiver request is approved, the Lead Monitor can decide to monitor a county since each county must be monitored at least every other year.

As indicated in MA-3225/2306, Application Processing – Corrective Action Procedures, the counties will only receive copies of the forms when the monitors cite a record for an improper action.
