Managed Care Update

Managed Care Update

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S.B. 808 became law – Medicaid moves from fee-for-service to Managed Care July 1, 2021.

Appx. 1.5 million NC citizens will be moved into private Medicaid Managed Care.

Medicaid Managed Care = Quality care with cost efficiencies through negotiated network costs with physicians and hospitals.

- Private health insurance coverage for nursing services or denial documentation for the prior approval period must be submitted to Medicaid

Provider Reconsideration Review Requests Process

- Providers may petition within 30 calendar days a written request for review of payment, payment denial, disallowance or payment adjustment.
- Submission must be received within 30 calendar days from receipt of notification of final payment disposition.
- Providers may appoint another individual to represent them through a separate written statement.

- Chief Medical Officer consideration of 3G-1 (Adult)
 policy criteria

• Skilled Nursing vs. Nurse Aide Level of Care

Private Duty Nursing (PDN) is substantial, complex, and continuous skilled nursing care. Skilled nursing does not include those tasks that can be delegated to *unlicensed assistive personnel* (21 NCAC 36).



Unlicensed Assistive Personnel

Unlicensed assistive personnel (UAP) is an umbrella term used to describe unlicensed health care assistants that have been trained to provide certain tasks of client care as *directed* by a licensed health care provider.

UAP include but are not limited to the following specific job titles:

Nurses' Aide (NA)

Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)

Patient Care Aide (PCA)

Home Health Aide (HHA)

Nurse Aide I Tasks

North Carolina Board of Nursing Nurse Aide I Tasks

I. PERSONAL CARE (ADL)

- Bathing (assist, bed bath, tub bath, shower, sitz)
- Mouth care
- Skin care
- Hair care
- Nail care
- Bedmaking (modified)
- Dressing and undressing

II. BODY MECHANICS

- Turn and position
- Transfer chair and stretcher
- Use of lifts
- Assist with ambulation
- Range of motion exercises

III. NUTRITION

- Prepare patients for meal time
- Feed patients
- Intake and output
- Force and restrict fluids

IV. ELIMINATION

- Bedpan/urinal
- Bowel/bladder retraining
- Collect/test specimens
- Perineal/catheter care
- Apply condom caths
- + Douches
 - Enemas
- + Insert rectal tubes/flatus bags
 - Empty drainage devices from body cavities/wounds
- + Maintain gastric suction

SAFETY

V.

- Side rails/ call rails
- Mitts and restraints
- CPR/Heimlich Maneuver
- Infection control Handwashing Isolation technique Standard precautions

VI. SPECIAL PROCEDURES

- Vital signs

Temp (oral, rectal,

- axillary)
- Pulse (radial, apical) Respirations
 - Respi
- BP
- Height and weight (stand-up scales/bed scales)
- Application of heat/cold
- Prevent and care for decubitus ulcers
- + Surgical skin preps and scrubs
 - Clean dressing changes
 - Apply ace bandages, TEDs and binders
 - + Apply and remove EKG monitor leads
 - Postmortem care
 - Cough/deep breathing

OXYGEN THERAPY

- Room Set-up
- Monitoring flow-rate

TRACHEOSTOMY CARE

STERILE DRESSING CHANGE

(Wound over 48 hours old)

I.V. FLUID – ASSISTIVE ACTIVITIES

- Assemble/flush tubing during set-up
- Monitoring flow-rate
- Site care/dressing change
- Discontinuing peripheral intravenous infusions

NUTRITION ACTIVITIES

- Oral/nasogastric infusions (after placement verification by licensed nurse)
- Gastrostomy feedings
- Clamping tubes
- Removing oral/nasogastric feeding tubes

SUCTIONING

- Oropharyngeal
- Nasopharyngeal

URINARY CATHETERS -Catheterizations

WOUND IRRIGATION

ELIMINATION PROCEDURES

- Ostomy Care

- DMA 3171 Verification School Nursing form
 - Please complete the form even though schools are closed due to COVID-19
 - Section V to include only days missed due to school absence, where the PDN nurse provides those hours in the home, must be signed by the beneficiary's caregiver.

- RAI timeliness Upload required documentation within 10 business days of RAI
- Most RAI's sent out due to CMS 485, primary insurance, incomplete/outdated documentation, missing/incomplete or inaccurate transfer/shared agreements.

- NP and PA signatures not permitted per policy
