## Family Planning Medicaid helps men take charge of their reproductive health.

Reproductive health is an important aspect of men's overall health and wellness. Taking care of your reproductive health helps to ensure that you are able to take part in healthy relationships and can maintain a healthy lifestyle. By paying attention to your reproductive health, you can reduce your risk of serious problems such as erectile dysfunction, infertility, and even certain types of cancers. Taking time to learn about your reproductive health and talking to your doctor about any questions or concerns you have is an important step toward maintaining your health.



### Screening/Testing

- STIs
- High blood pressure
- Hepatitis B and C
- HIV/AIDS

### Over-the-Counter Supplies

- Condoms
- Spermicides

### Doctor's Visits

- Annual physical exam
- 6 follow-up visits

### Vaccines

- Human Papillomavirus (HPV)

### Sexually transmitted infections (STIs) Treatment

- For most common sexually transmitted infections (STIs), including gonorrhea, chlamydia, and herpes

### Referrals

- PrEP (Pre-exposure prophylaxis to prevent HIV)
- HIV/AIDS treatment
- Additional follow-up needs that come up during your visit

### Sterilization

- Vasectomy (must be 21+)

### Education/Counseling

- Reproductive goals
- STI prevention and management
- Pregnancy prevention

### Transportation

- To and from visits

## Men's Health Spotlight: PrEP

Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or PrEP, is a safe and effective medication that can reduce your risk of getting HIV.

PrEP may be a good option if you don't have HIV, and:

- You have a sexual partner living with HIV, or
- You don't consistently use condoms, or
- You have been diagnosed with an STD recently, or
- You inject drugs and share needles/equipment with other people, or
- You've used PEP (post-exposure prophylaxis) in the past

Stay prepared  
with PrEP!

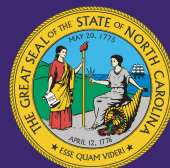
