Family Planning Medicaid helps men take charge of their reproductive health.

Reproductive health is an important aspect of men's overall health and wellness. Taking care of your reproductive health helps to ensure that you are able to take part in healthy relationships and can maintain a healthy lifestyle. By paying attention to your reproductive health, you can reduce your risk of serious problems such as erectile dysfunction, infertility, and even certain types of cancers. Taking time to learn about your reproductive health and talking to your doctor about any questions or concerns you have is an important step towards maintaining your health.

Men's Health Spotlight: PrEP

Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or PrEP, is a safe and effective medication that can reduce your risk of getting HIV.

PrEP may be a good option if you don't have HIV, and:

- · You have a sexual partner living with HIV, or
- You don't consistently use condoms, or
- · You have been diagnosed with an STD recently, or
- · You inject drugs and share needles/equipment with other
- · You've used PEP (post-exposure prophylaxis) in the past

Family Planning Medicaid covers screening and referral for PrEP, as well as the followup visits and testing needed while taking PrEP. Your provider can also help you enroll in the Ready, Set, PrEP program, which covers the cost of your PrEP medication.







Quality, Population Health, and Evaluation

Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (CAHPS®)

- Developed by AHRQ, the Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (CAHPS) 5.1 Health Plan Surveys are a set of standardized surveys that assess patient perspectives on care with goals of advancing understanding and improving patients' experiences. Adult Medicaid members and parents or caretakers of child Medicaid members completed the surveys from June to October 2022. Respondents provided feedback on experiences with care and services over the last six months. The survey includes a set of measures that can be classified as: 1) global ratings (rating experience on a scale of 0 to 10), 2) composite measures (groups of related questions combining to form a composite), and 3) individual measures (based on a single question).
- All trend data before 2022 were collected prior to the implementation of Prepaid Health Plans.




