<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #30: Personal Care Services Assessments</u> TUESDAY, MARCH 31, 2020

On March 10, 2020, Governor Roy Cooper issued an executive order declaring a State of Emergency for North Carolina to respond to COVID-19. In addition, the Department of Health and Human Services made several recommendations to slow the spread of COVID-19 and reduce the number of people infected.

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #27: Update for PACE Organizations</u> MONDAY, MARCH 30, 2020

PACE organizations are responsible for providing all required Medicare and Medicaid covered services to its PACE participants. This responsibility also extends to the participants' home setting. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, NC Medicaid recognizes that PACE organizations will need to adjust business operations and the methods utilized to address the needs of PACE participants.

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #26: Expansion of Home Infusion Therapy Drug Categories:</u> <u>Clinical Policy Modification 3H-1</u> **MONDAY, MARCH 30, 2020** 

Effective March 30, 2020 NC Medicaid is temporarily modifying the Home Infusion Therapy Clinical Coverage Policy No.: 3H-1 to better enable the delivery of remote care to Medicaid members. These temporary changes will end the earlier of the cancellation of the North Carolina state of emergency declaration or when this policy is rescinded. This expansion of home infusion therapy serves to allow beneficiaries to receive services in the home rather than in a dedication infusion center to reduce potential exposure to COVID-19.

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #25: Emergency Update to NC Medicaid and NC Health</u> <u>Choice Preferred Drug List (PDL) and REMS Program Flexibilities</u> **FRIDAY, MARCH 27, 2020** 

Effective March 25, 2020, due to drug shortages in the marketplace, the NC Medicaid and NC Health Choice PDL Category of "Respiratory: Beta-Adrenergic Handheld, Short Acting" has changed.

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #24: NC Medicaid Cost Report Filing Extensions Due to</u> <u>COVID-19</u> FRIDAY, MARCH 27, 2020

Select provider types enrolled in the North Carolina Medicaid Program are required to file annual Medicaid cost reports utilizing cost reporting schedules which are based on approved Medicare cost reporting platforms.

Medicaid beneficiaries impacted by COVID-19 including individuals participating in the NC Innovations Waiver and the NC TBI Waiver. NC Medicaid has created an emergency planning document called Appendix K to seek approval to modify the scope, frequency, amount and setting of how waiver services are used and approved.

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #18: Guidelines for Non-Emergency Medical Transportation</u> THURSDAY, MARCH 26, 2020

This Bulletin provides information to local Departments of Social Services (DSS) and NEMT providers on NC Medicaid's requirements for NEMT services, the recommended safety procedures and protocols to help reduce the spread of COVID-19 and guidance.

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #17: Prior Approval for Hydroxychloroquine and Chloroquine</u> <u>Products</u> **THURSDAY, MARCH 26, 2020** 

Effective March 27, 2020, North Carolina Medicaid is requiring prior approval for hydroxychloroquine and chloroquine containing products. Prior approval is required to ensure beneficiaries continue to have access to these medications for maintenance of their autoimmune conditions, for treatment of malaria, and for treatment of extraintestinal amebiasis.

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #16: Re-verification Due Dates Extended for NC Medicaid</u> <u>Providers</u> **THURSDAY, MARCH 26, 2020** 

To offset potential hardships due to COVID-19, for NC Medicaid and Health Choice providers who were due to re-verify their enrollment between the dates of March 1, 2020 and June 30, 2020, NCTracks has reset your re-verification due date to Sept. 13, 2020.

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #15: Medicaid and NC Health Choice Temporary Flexibilities -</u> <u>1135 Waiver Provisions</u> **TUESDAY, MARCH 24, 2020** 

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has granted NC Medicaid the authority to temporarily modify several Medicaid and NC Health Choice policies



retroactive to March 1, 2020, and through the end of federal emergency declaration or when the flexibility is ended by the State or CMS

In response to the anticipated spread of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in North Carolina, EviCore, NC Medicaid's contracted vendor for imaging services, will autoapprove the following chest CT codes effective immediately:

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #12: Suspension of Pharmacy POS Adult and Pediatric</u> <u>Behavioral Health Clinical Edits</u> **TUESDAY, MARCH 24, 2020** 

The Outpatient Pharmacy point of sale (POS) adult and pediatric clinical edits for behavioral health medications will temporarily suspend effective March 23, 2020. These point of sale edits target dosages exceeding the FDA approved maximum limit and in class therapeutic duplication.

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #11: Outpatient Specialized Therapies Temporary Flexibilities</u> **TUESDAY, MARCH 24, 2020** 

Effective March 23, 2020, if medically necessary, outpatient Respiratory Therapy (RT) services provided through the Independent Practitioner Provider (IPP) program that typically require prior authorization (PA), may be provided to NC Medicaid and NC Health Choice beneficiaries without PA.

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<u>SPECIAL BULLETIN COVID-19 #10: Durable Medical Equipment: Temporary Flexibilities</u> <u>Effective March 23, 2020</u> **TUESDAY, MARCH 24, 2020**
